Letter From the Chairman



Mad and Scared

I would be mad at any political party that would be so mean-spirited to hold a meeting the night of a national President inauguration to plan how to make the President fail. When

Newt Gingrich admitted on national TV that he, Paul Ryan, Eric Canton and others held a Republican caucus, at a Washington D.C. restaurant on inauguration night to plot how to destroy President Obama's administration I got real mad. To me this is close to treason because all of them knew that the country was in a financial crisis, caused by their former leader, and their action could/would have a destructive effect on this country. But they did not care and believe only they could possibly have the answers, and therefore needed to control this country. This type of action is just WRONG, and they started the "NO" block vote against President Obama's programs which affected progress in this country. So yes I am MAD and I am SCARED because it worked.

I am scared that this younger generation does not understand the intended implications of "We want our country back", "Return to the days of our forefathers" and all the talk about the days of George Washington and James Madison and even Abraham Lincoln. know which businesses are owned by us and how to locate them. Therefore, we must have a central business directory which is broadly circulated and supported by our community. The ORR Business Directory is the central business directory of the Atlanta Black community.

As the mission statement shows, the ORR was created more than 10 years ago to change the economic landscape of the Black community. And, since Black-owned businesses are the vehicle to economic freedom, the ORR had to find out what is hindering the growth of community support for our businesses. The ORR discovered that one of the fundamental problems Black businesses have is a lack of awareness that they exist.

To address this problem, the ORR discovered that there was no better way to make the community aware of the existence of Black businesses than through Black preachers, the leaders of the Black churches. So, the primary strategy of the ORR became to connect consumers with Black businesses primarily through churches.

In conjunction with the Black Church, The Conductor newspaper was born. The Concerned Black Clergy are founding members of the movement.

Your Conductor newspaper OvergroundRR!!® is a progeny of the North Star. It was a newspaper which played a pivotal role in the Underground Railroad movement. The North Star newspaper was published by Frederick Douglass beginning on December 3, 1847. Significantly, the The North Star was printed in the basement of Memorial African Methodist Episcopal Zion church located in Rochester, New York.

In preparing The Call and The Response for this issue of The Conductor, the editorial board debated how much should be quoted or reprinted of Our Founding Father Frederick Douglass' inspiring first article in the first issue of the North Star. We were moved so much by his words that we wanted to share some of them with you:

We are now about to assume the management of the editorial department of a newspaper, devoted to the cause of Liberty, Humanity and Progress. The position is one which, with the purest motives, we have long desired to occupy. It has long been our anxious wish to see, in this slave-holding, slave-trading, and Negro-hating land, a printing-press and paper, permanently established, under the complete control and direction of the immediate victims of slavery and oppression.

It is scarcely necessary for us to say that our desire to occupy our present position at the head of an Antislavery Journal, has resulted from no unworthy distrust or ungrateful want of appreciation of the zeal, integrity, or ability of the noble band of white laborers, in this department of our cause; but, from a sincere and settled conviction that such a Journal, if conducted with only moderate skill and ability, would do a most important and indispensable work, which it would be wholly impossible for our white friends to do for us.

It is neither a reflection on the fidelity, nor a disparagement of the ability of

our friends and fellow-laborers, to assert what "common sense affirms and only folly denies," that the man who has suffered the wrong is the man to demand redress,—that the man STRUCK is the man to CRY OUT—and that he who has endured the cruel pangs of Slavery is the man to advocate Liberty. It is evident we must be our own representatives and advocates... In the grand struggle for liberty and equality now waging, it is meet, right and essential that there should arise in our ranks authors and editors, as well as orators, for it is in these capacities that the most permanent good can be rendered to our cause.

Hitherto the immediate victims of slavery and prejudice, owing to various causes, have had little share in this department of effort: they have frequently undertaken, and almost as frequently failed. This latter fact has often been urged by our friends against our engaging in the present enterprise; but, so far from convincing



THE CONCERNED BLACK CLERGY

s the moral compass of our Acommunity, we seek to be intimately engaged in the decision making process that affects the lives of all people. In other words, we want to be called and consulted first, when problems develop, exist or persist. And we will respond to those calls with all deliberate speed and due diligence, based upon our common values of faith, family and community. It is our position to be proactive, not reactive, and to utilize the ingenuity of our membership to develop initiatives and programs that will lead us from the ravages of an impoverished condition. Because when people live with their backs against the wall, they need to know that there is someone who stands on the side of the oppressed.

It was the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. who once said that life's most persistent and urgent question is what are you doing for others? And by virtue of our common cause, we are called upon to do the work that will liberate people from the depth of their circumstances. Our mission is to provide leadership, advocacy, and service to the homeless, helpless and hopeless in our community. With God as our guide, faith as our foundation, and deliverance as our aspiration, it is my

sincere heartfelt prayer, that together we will build upon the great legacy that began twenty eight years ago, which seeks to serve the least, the lost, the locked out, the marginalized and oppressed people in our society. We will make it our priority to continue to create outreach programs and partner with civic, community and other non-profit organizations that are addressing the needs of the homeless. The homeless population is expanding, while services and resources on the state and federal level are diminishing. But as a people of faith, we are called upon to be sensitive to the plight of the poor. We cannot turn our backs on this systemic problem.

The CBC has a partnership with the Wells Fargo Corporation to address this challenge in our community. It is an initiative that developed at the height of the foreclosure crisis to help people remain in their homes, and learn to better manage their resources. This program seeks to connect clergy and their memberships with relevant banking products and services that promote neighborhood stability and financial success in our communities. In addition to this initiative, it is imperative that we leverage relationships with other corporate sponsors such as Habitat for Humanity

and 1st Choice. Both of these outstanding organizations provide first time homebuyer workshops and other educational services relative to homeownership.

I recognize that the issue of homelessness is extremely broad and complex and that it is not limited to those who reside in shelters and sleep under bridges. But it is also represented by those who are living in the basement of family and friends, or perhaps living in extended stay motels. There are many variables that cause and create homelessness. Chief among them are the economic conditions under which we live. Unfortunately, the greatest disparity between the rich and the poor in this nation exist here in the city of Atlanta. We also hold the dubious distinction of being the poorest city in the US for children with the largest number of homeless children. So in our quest to deal with the homeless issue, we must not overlook our brothers, but we must channel our attention greatly to women and children.

We must continue to support and create programs and services that address the employment issues in our community. The employment market will never be what it once was. This is why we must help our people develop a spirit of entrepreneurism. It is imperative that we encourage and educate our communities on how to create and support small businesses in our community. We want to provide resources for good business practices that develop into the tools necessary for creating sound business plans to provide consistent quality customer service which is critical product delivery, access to financial resources the sustainability of capital. All of which work together to eliminating homelessness and poverty.

We are called upon in the words of the prophet Micah, to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God. It is my prayer that as God leads me, God will lead this organization with the same sense of urgency and focus that has been demonstrated by our founding members. But I have learned that a leader is only as good as those who follow them. And I have absolutely no interest in being a lone ranger in this mission. Independently we can accomplish some things, but together we can accomplish so much more.

Ahead of the Curve

Kenneth Samuel Hudson, the first African-American NBA referee died on Wednesday May 9, 2012 at the age of 72. He made history in 1968 by becoming the first African-American full-time referee in the National Basketball Association, but his legacy stretches far beyond the court. The night after his death, the Atlanta Hawks and Boston Celtics tipped off Game 6 of their first-round playoff series. Three referees -- Derrick Stafford, Eric Lewis and Bill Kennedy -- put whistles around their necks and took the court in Boston. All three were African-American.

In the mid-1960s, Mr. Hudson caught the eye of NBA Hall of Famer Bill Russell who persuaded legendary Celtics coach Red Auerbach to allow Mr. Hudson to referee the team's training camp scrimmages. He was a nervous wreck when a snowstorm in Boston made it possible for his official call, even his parents did not know until they turned on the television. Mr. Hudson refereed several hundred games professionally from 1968-72 which prompted the 5-foot-6 legend to publish an autobiography, "A Tree Stump in the Valley of Redwoods." Though Ken Hudson's name will forever be etched into basketball history books, his passion for the game of basketball will breathe forever.

In the early 1970s his refereeing career was shelved and soon after Mr. Hudson founded the Boston Shootout, which remains an attractive tournament to top high school talent nationwide. He was committed to exposing young people, to inspire them and work with them to follow their dreams regardless of the obstacles.

Good Customer Service is critical to the success of any small business.

As we look forward to our 2013 Black Church Marching2March Campaign, we plan to address the issues around good Customer Service. We have partnerships with the Atlanta Business League, Concerned Black Clergy, The Black Chamber of Commerce and other important institutions throughout our communities. Our aim is to change the culture of how we do business in the African American Community. We can learn a lot from each other, particularly from those businesses that have a good track record on Customer

First, let us dispel the MYTH that most Black Businesses are sub-par. Too often we are our own worst enemies. Admittedly, there are SOME Black Business that just don't treat its' customers with maximum respect. Should we just leave and stop

supporting that business? Should we bring our concerns to the attention of the Manager or Owner? Of course we should, but with the intent to assist the business in improving its' Customer Service. If the truth be told, we have often received BAD CUSTOMER SERVICE from major Department Stores, major Banks, major grocery chains, and other businesses owned by the majority communities, and the fact is: WE DID NOT DISCONTINUE OUR SUPPORT of those businesses. Why then do we have a different standard for our own Black Owned Businesses? Why are we so ready to discontinue our support or just abandon our businesses completely due to a single bad experience?

If we in the African American community are going to continue to Teach Our Dollars Some \$cents, then we have got to find better ways of supporting each other. We have got to figure out how to work through our differences and build networks of mutual benefit. All other Ethnic Groups do a much better job of circulating the money within their own communities several times. Historically, when we could only buy and sell within our own communities, we too did a great job of circulating our dollars within our own communities several times. We understood the value of mutual business collaborations. Somewhere, we lost that idea. Without even giving it a second thought, we take our dollars out of our communities as soon as we get them.

Secondly, we have got to do extensive Customer Service Training. Our goal is to pull together the very best Trainers we have to offer and provide this service to Employers throughout Metro Atlanta. Customer Service is an issue that can be addressed because it can be learned. We witness good customer service every day and our aim is to duplicate and expand the good and minimize the bad. Perhaps we can begin by focusing on that institution closest to us - our Banks.

We are told that less than 3% of Black Dollars find their way into Black Owned Banks. This is unconscionable and this is NOT true for any other Ethnic Group. Our Banks are critical to our ability to expand small Black Owned Businesses, establish more Home Ownership in the African American community, and creating JOBS. We could begin to change the very nature of our economic situation by simply opening up accounts and supporting Capitol City and Citizens Trust Banks. If churches and businesses that have monies sitting in majority owned banks would simply MOVE some of those dollars to Capitol City and to Citizens Trust, we could Teach Our Dollars some more \$cents and thereby Empower ourselves.










Architecture & Design Brings the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center to Life






The Ray Charles Performing Arts Center is evidence of Morehouse College's commitment to enhancing the study of the arts. Designed to serve the academic mission of the Department of Music, as well as meet the performance space requirements of the College campus, the Center is home to the Morehouse College Glee Club, Morehouse Jazz Band, Morehouse College Jazz Ensemble and "House of Funk" Marching Band. The Center's architectural features capture the beauty of the traditional red brick bar accents and columns on the main campus, while adding modern, artistic elements of light colored stone accents, glass walls and cathedral ceilings.

Morehouse College says "Long live the Genius" through the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center. A \$20 million, 76,000 square-foot facility—located at the edge of the historic West End district at the corner of Joseph P. Lowery and West End Avenue—providing an attractive and welcoming gateway to the south entrance of the campus.

The design of the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center pays homage to the look and feel of the Morehouse campus with complements to other architectural structures.



Ray Charles Robinson

There is not much about Ray Charles Robinson's beginning that could have predicted the profound influence he would have on Morehouse College, Atlanta and the American music landscape. He was born into abject poverty

to a single mother in 1930, an era marked by the Great Depression and brutal racism. He witnessed the drowning of his only brother, George. He lost his sight at the age of six and was orphaned at 15.

Charles' recording career began in 1949 and soon after he started mixing music genres leading to the successful release of "I Got a Woman", which is popularly credited as the first true "soul" record. In creating the song, Charles reworded the gospel tune, "Jesus Is All the World to Me", adding deep church inflections to his music. One of the singer's most moving and enduring musical recordings is his oft-played rendition of "America, the Beautiful".

The lessons of hardships and challenges were instrumental in honing one of the greatest music pioneers of our times. Over the course of six decades, the little blind boy from Florida rightfully earned the title of "The Genius of Soul". An accomplished pianist and songwriter, Charles was one of the first inductees into numerous music halls of fame, including the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, as well as those for Jazz and Rhythm and Blues.

From blindness to greatness, from musical mimic to musical genius, Ray Charles' life was one of extremes and extraordinary talent that came to an end after 73 years on June 10, 2004.

In 2001, Morehouse College honored Charles with the Candle Award for Lifetime Achievement in Arts and Entertainment, and later that same year granted him an honorary doctor of humane letters. It is also the year that Charles and his longtime business manager, Joe Adams, gave a gift of \$1 million to Morehouse, where Charles had approved plans for the building of the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center.

On entering the world-class Emma and Joe Adams Concert Hall, patrons will be impressed by the 550-fixed-seat capacity featuring a motorized orchestra pit that can be raised to provide additional seating. Its incomparable acoustics will delight the ear of even the novice listener.

A unique attribute of the Center is the Eugene Mitchell Performance Lawn - located outside at the rear of the band rehearsal room. A wall in the band rehearsal room can be raised, transforming the space into a stage. The performance lawn, which will seat approximately 200 patrons in chairs and on blankets, begs for the occasional impromptu musical performances or casual gatherings of students between classes.

Music Academic Building

The Morehouse College music program is nearly 100 years old, dating back to the founding of the world-renowned Morehouse College Glee Club in 1911. The Music Academic Building is designed to address the future instructional, rehearsal and performance space needs for several generations of Morehouse students. The building features 12 faculty studios, two electronic classrooms, nine practice rooms, dedicated storage areas for students' instruments, a library for sheet music and three academic labs.

heating and air conditioning projects on a napkin. A significant change to this has been in the rise of the design-build system of project delivery where the design and construction is typically handled by a single entity. This is opposite the traditional design-build where project owners hired an architect for the design and a contractor for the construction. The design-build concept of collaboration was part of Brown's plan in 1984 and is a fundamental component of his firm today. Brown's use of the "design-build" concept helps to eliminate conflicts, scheduling difficulties and budget challenges.

Lifelong Influences

As sole proprietors of small businesses, he watched how his parents dealt with customers to cultivate and build relationships. Even though Brown was without an architect to advise him before beginning his six-year studies at Tuskegee University in Architecture, he used the teachings and influences of his mother and father to "lift the veil of ignorance" through education and relationship building. This led to his being recruited by the Atlanta architectural firm of Aeck Associates (now Lord Aeck Sargent) while still in school.

As his studies concluded and graduating magna cum laude his career took him to Fry and Welch/Steven & Wilkinson where in 1980 he became part of the team that worked on the Atlanta airport terminal driven by the late Atlanta Mayor, Maynard Jackson. On completion of this project he was approached by Dillingham Construction to work as a project architect giving him the opportunity to see how things were being built. As a result, the experience changed his perspective and his working habits that remain in effect today.


Other individuals with influence on his life include Manuel Maloof, construction pioneer Herman Russell and businessman Felker

Ward. Now he shares his wisdom in mentoring others and giving back to the community. This is a key driver in leadership for Brown.

Civic Responsibility

Meeting the late Manuel Maloof (DeKalb County CEO) was challenging and rewarding for Brown. Maloof asked him to sit on the board for Grady Hospital and after 20 years of service, of which 14 were as Chairman. In his civic duty, he learned how to balance supply and demand and how to manage a business without all the resources needed. Over the years his community work has grown to include education and state corrections. Brown's giving back has helped sharpen his business skills in making tough decisions while maintaining his mission.

Brown says, "Architecture is more than just designing buildings; it's investing in the community". His firm is a vehicle in which to give back to the community and he readily gives credit to his parents and employees for making it possible. Community involvement and relationship building is how RL Brown & Associartes came to be the design firm chosen for the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center, whereby "One project leads to another".

•Garden hoses can cause major damage if not disconnected. During cold snaps, if a garden hose is left connected, ice will form and pressure will build up in the water lines inside your home. Once this occurs, a water line leak or break is common. This can cause severe damage to the home. Disconnect garden hoses and drain outdoor pipes to prevent damage during

•After disconnecting hoses, you should install an exterior, insulated faucet jacket. This will protect your outdoor faucets, as well as the connecting lines running into the home, from freezing temperatures. Also, be sure to utilize the shut-off valves located inside your home to drain water from pipes leading to outdoor hose bibs. These valves can typically be found under sinks, in crawl spaces or basements, near your water heater or your meter, but every home is different and some homes may not be equipped with these valves.

•Circulating warm air helps keep pipes in the walls from freezing. Keep your house temperature above 55 degrees to prevent pipes from freezing, open cabinet doors under sinks and faucets, and near exterior walls to help circulate warm air and keep pipes warm.

•Close crawl space vents and garage doors, es



pecially if your water heater is in the garage.

•Check to be sure that snow is not restricting your water drainage. Watch the area around your sump pump discharge line used to avoid flooding indoors, as this line drains from a basement to an outside area. If the drainage area is blocked by snow or flowing into a puddle, freezing could occur as well as water backing-up into the house.


Before becoming an accountant or even an en-

As Wilson makes the rounds in his IHOP din-



n celebration of the many contributions Land accomplishments of African American families, the Concerned Black Clergy of Metropolitan Atlanta, will present our 2012 Annual Salute to Black Families Celebration on Saturday, November 3, 2012, 12 noon at the Georgia International Convention Center, located at 2020 Convention Center Concourse, in College Park, Georgia. The theme for this year's celebration is, "Realizing the Beloved Community." We are proud to honor numerous outstanding families in our churches and other community leaders in areas such as education, business, politics, religion and medicine. More than 800 people are anticipated to be our guests as we celebrate the outstanding work of some very deserving persons in our community.

Concerned Black Clergy, better known as CBC, was officially chartered in 1983 in response to the problems emerging in the city related to missing and murdered children. The founding leaders, both clergy and lay, were concerned about the negative black male images that were prevalent and being internalized by black children, especially black boys. The idea emerged that CBC needed to aggressively tackle the problem of negative black male images prominent in the black community. As a result, the salutes to the black community, to its heritage, to its leaders, and to its achievements were launched. Since the beginning of CBC, it has sponsored yearly salutes to the fathers, to the mothers, and to the black heritage as a way to promote positive images not only for black boys but also for black girls.

With so much negative press permeating through the African American community due to high rates of divorce, single parents, and out of wed-lock births, we have witnessed an all too familiar story of our families being ripped apart due to a constant cultural crisis that often leads to people being kicked to the curb. If we continue to allow our families to fall apart, our society will remain on a path of increasing deterioration. Systemic problems related to education, racism, lack of resources and institutionalization are major contributors to this persistent problem.

As servants of God, the CBC believes that our number one ministry is our family. Therefore, we believe that this event is significant because the heart of the black community is family. As one of the key anchor institutions for our people, family has always been the social fabric which moves us forward. Family provides a safe, nurturing atmosphere where children can be conceived, born, adopted, disciplined, loved, encouraged, instructed, and ultimately released to form their own families. It's the place that is designed to meet our basic human needs. A place to experience belonging. It's a place to teach established social, community, moral and spiritual values. Family provides us with a safe place to discover the meaning of life. Everybody needs a family.

Subsequently, CBC is sounding the trumpet

to engage people of faith and goodwill in an effort to celebrate the highest ideals of our people, and place emphasis on establishing and developing strong familial relationships.

Historically, part of the CBC salutes has been the effort to recruit other churches into the process of honoring and promoting people who have made significant contributions to the positive uplift of the black community. Consequently, individual black churches select several people from their congregations who will be publicly honored at the salute as well. As we continue to expand our reach, this will enable us to make a more impressive impact on our community at large.

Some of the benefits for clergy being involved in CBC are that it provides an opportunity for clergy to identify resources for doing ministry; gives them a platform to discuss and share ministry ideas and challenges with other clergy; consistent engagement of the issues that adversely impact the lives of people, and persistent fellowship opportunities. As the primary, principle centered, proactive organization of faith in metro Atlanta, we pray that our efforts will always serve as the catalyst by which change occurs in our community as we address the systemic, social, economic, political, and cultural ills affecting our community.

us of the impolicy of our course, it serves to confirm us in the necessity, if not the wisdom of our undertaking. That others have failed, is a reason for OUR earnestly endeavoring to succeed. Our race must be vindicated from the embarrassing imputations resulting from former non-success. We believe that what ought to be done, can be done. We say this, in no self-confident or boastful spirit, but with a full sense of our weakness and unworthiness, relying upon the Most High for wisdom and strength to support us in our righteous undertaking. We are not wholly unaware of the duties, hardships and responsibilities of our position. We have easily imagined some, and friends have not hesitated to inform us of others. Many doubtless are yet to be revealed by that infallible teacher, experience. A view of them solemnize, but do not appal us. We have counted the cost. Our mind is made up, and we are resolved to go forward.


A Living Legend Retires Rev. Dr. Gerald Durley

 $R^{\rm ev.\,Dr.\,Gerald\,Durley}$ is a legendary "war-rior/prophet" minister who, for more than a quarter of a century, has not only transcended his Christian faith and his Providence Missionary Baptist Church pulpit, but has embraced and encouraged an entire generation of Atlanta's unique brand of civil and human rightsbased leadership. On August 4, 2012, hundreds of distinguished leaders and lay people joined together for his retirement from Providence after 25 years leading God's charge. In the words of Andrew Young, "Gerald Durley is a pastor's pastor." This was seconded by Rev. Timothy McDonald saying, "He's one of a kind."

A professional psychologist and a well-trained minister, his commitment to what he does and has done goes as deep as his own life. Dr. Durley was born in Wichita, Kansas, grew up in California and graduated from high school in Denver, Colorado. Having exceptional basketball skills and a deep interest in improving the civil and human rights of African Americans, Dr. Durley chose to leave the west and venture south to Tennessee State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Psychology. While working on his undergraduate degree, he played on a championship basketball team, and served as student government president and was very active in the civil rights movement. After graduating, Dr. Durley became one of the first Peace Corp volunteers to enter Nigeria, West Africa. From Africa he ventured to Switzerland where he enrolled in postgraduate studies at the University of Neuchantel. While there, he was invited to play for one of the Swiss National Basketball teams.

When he returned to the United States, Dr. Durley earned one of the first Masters Degrees in Community Mental Health from Northern Illinois University where he again got involved in the struggle for human dignity. He assisted in the founding of the Afro-American Cultural Organization whose goal was to teach minorities about their heritage. Recognizing his sincerity for positive change, the U.S. Office of Education invited him to move to Washington, D.C. and become Assistant Branch Chief of Pupil Personnel Services. A compelling desire to be even better prepared dictated that Dr. Durley enter the University of Massachusetts and earn a Doctorate Degree in Urban Education and Psychology and a Master of Divinity Degree from Howard University.

The Institute for Services to Education, Inc. invited Dr. Durley to direct many of its major projects working with historically black colleges and universities. He later founded and became president and CEO of Perspectives International, Inc. to produce positive, constructive programs for African Americans and other minority communities. Having been a dedicated educator, an effective psychologist,

a nationally sought after motivational speaker, Dr. Durley was gravely disturbed by the decaying moral, social and family value systems throughout the nation. Combining the disciplines of psychology and religion, Dr. Durley moved to Atlanta, Georgia and accepted the position as Director of the Counseling Center at Clark Atlanta University and later became Dean of Student Affairs at Clark Atlanta.

His concern for families and children encouraged him to accept the Executive Directorship of the Head Start Program for Fulton and Douglas Counties in Georgia. Realizing that the spirit and mind must work in concert with the physical body, Dr. Durley joined the faculty at the Morehouse School of Medicine as the Director of the Health Promotion Resource Center and has been intricately involved in the

global warming climate change discussions across the country. He has served on the Conservation Fund's National Forum on Children and appears in the film, The Great Warming where he is discussing climate change with urban youngsters at the YMCA. Dr. Durley truly believes that for the environment to be saved the educational, scientific, business, political and religious communities must join forces and agree on positive actions for immediate, constructive change.

For several years, Dr. Durley has traveled to other countries with Muslims, Christians, and Jews to better understand the differences and similarities among people, cultures and beliefs. He has worked across faith lines to promote interfaith relations, and has been a vocal, outspoken advocate for assisting groups and individuals to communicate across faith disciplines.

Dr. Durley is called upon to address hundreds of civic, political, higher education, and social groups on various topics. He is a highly sought after motivational/inspirational speaker.

Pastor Durley was an associate pastor at Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Arlington, Virginia. He was ordained and became a pulpit associate at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. He is now officially retired as the Pastor of the historic Providence Missionary Baptist Church of Atlanta. He has been married for more than forty-five years to his wife, Muriel.

Rev. Durley's wife, Muriel says for over the past 45 years "It's been a surprising journey. When I met my husband, he told me he had no plans to become a pastor or a minister." Smiling softly, she added, "Well, God had other plans, as you can see. It's been an amazing journey. We are just doing what God wanted us to do." Dr. Durley leaves a strong legacy of love and salvation of Jesus Christ and God's power to change lives.

Dr. Durley says, "I've been called to create the kind of place where all of us can find who we are and who God called us to be, and break down the barriers between Jews, Muslims, Shiites, because we are all under one God. What we've tried to do here in Atlanta is to create an environment where everybody can grow to their highest potential. When you create that kind of environment, where people feel comfortable in their own skin, we can all grow".

Past Presidents of the Concerned Black Clergy unanimously say Dr. Gerald Durley has made an indelible imprint on the hearts, minds, and souls of many, from Atlanta to Africa, and be-







 - Photos should be 300 dpi (or other acceptable sizes)
 - Vector format if you want to use the photo on a large piece such as a banner.
 - Keep head shots and a few "staged" action photos on hand. (The action

photos should tell a story.)

- 3. Biographical information on relevant persons those persons who speak for your organization your church or synagogue or mosque.
- 4. A Press or Information Kit
- 5. Collateral materials flyers, brochures, posters, etc.
- 6. A media crisis plan

The Press Release and the Media Advisory may be a part of your tools but they are written per event or occasion.

How to Market Your Ministry

Have you ever wondered what you might do to get the word out about the many wonderful God filled happenings at your place of worship?

When the goal is to get the attention of those whom you want to invite, receive, and maintain as active members of your church, you must not only get them to come inside the church, but get them to stay.

Here's the tip:

In the spirit of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the new Chief Executive Officer of Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), Charles Steele, Jr., will renew their commitment to bringing about the promise of 'one nation, under God, INDIVISIBLE' together with the commitment to activate the 'strength to love' within the community of humankind.

Charles Steele, Jr. was born on August 3, 1946, in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. His dedication to serving is evident through his many worth-while and tangible accomplishments. He and his wife, Cathelean Annette Steele, are the proud parents of two daughters, LeKeisha and Charles.

One of his first priorities as CEO of the civil rights group will be to improve the organization's "dismal" finances. Sound economic footing is something the SCLC is striving toward, said Steele, who runs an East Pointbased consulting firm. Although SCLS has Christian principles, it is not a church; it is a business that must be run like a business. The Tuscaloosa, AL, native said he wanted to build a corporate roundtable board of international and domestic companies that can each commit between \$75,000 and \$100,000 annually. "We've got to have movement and we're going to have it, but movement costs."

Steele previously served as SCLC president from 2004 to 2009 and is credited with spear-heading efforts to have a new SCLC headquarters built and increasing membership. During his tenure, Steele opened international conflict

resolution centers and helped build the group's \$3.3 million headquarters in downtown Atlanta

He returns to SCLC as it continues to go through crisis of infighting and financial and legal problems. It is believed that Steele's credibility is what SCLC needs right now. His recognition in corporations and nationally will help the organization move beyond the past and swiftly into the future to solidify the work of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference

The Objectives of the SCLC are:

- To promote spiritual principles within our membership and local communities.
- To educate youth and adults in the areas of personal responsibility, leadership potential, and community service.
- To ensure economic justice and civil rights in the areas of discrimination and affirmative action.
- To eradicate environmental classism and racism wherever it exists.

The SCLC challenges all people of good will, of every persuasion, who believe in the principles espoused by Martin Luther King, Jr. to join them in their mission.

History

The very beginnings of the SCLC can be traced back to the Montgomery Bus Boycott. The Montgomery Bus Boycott began on De-

cember 5, 1955 after Rosa Parks was arrested for refusing to give up her seat to a white man



on the bus. The boycott lasted for 381 days and ended on December 21, 1956, with the desegregation of the Montgomery bus system. The boycott was carried out by the newly established Montgomery Improvement Association (MIA). Martin Luther King, Jr. served as President and Ralph David Abernathy served as Program Director. It was one of history's most dramatic and massive nonviolent protests, stunning the nation and the world.

The boycott was also a signal to Black America to begin a new phase of the long struggle, a phase that came to be known as the modern civil rights movement. As bus boycotts spread across the South, leaders of the MIA and other protest groups met in Atlanta in January of 1957 to form a regional organization and coordinate protest activities across the South.

Despite a bombing of the home and church

of Ralph David Abernathy during the Atlanta meeting, 60 persons from ten states assembled and announced the founding of the Southern Leadership Conference on Transportation and Nonviolent Integration. They issued a document declaring that civil rights are essential to democracy, that segregation must end, and that all Black people should reject segregation absolutely and nonviolently.

Further organizing was done at a meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana on February 14, 1957. The organization shortened its name to Southern Leadership Conference, established an Executive Board of Directors, and elected officers, including Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. as President, Dr. Ralph David Abernathy as Financial Secretary-Treasurer, Rev. C. K. Steele of Tallahassee, Florida as Vice President, Rev. T. J. Jemison of Baton Rouge, Louisiana as Secretary, and Attorney I. M. Augustine of New Orleans, Louisiana as General Counsel.

At its first convention in Montgomery in August 1957, the Southern Leadership Conference adopted the current name, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Basic decisions made by the founders at these early meeting included the adoption of nonviolent mass action as the cornerstone of strategy, the affiliation of local community organizations with SCLC across the South, and a determination to make the SCLC movement open to all, regardless of race, religion, or background.

50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MARCH

DR. KING'S "I HAVE A DREAM" SPEECH

A news conference held at SCLC national headquarters kicked off the official planning/ events of global commemorations August 24-28, 2013 at both the Lincoln Memorial and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial on the Mall in Washington, D.C. Spirits are being uplifted once again during a time when rights are being challenged in communities across the United States.



The renowned Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) in concert with The King Center announced commemorative plans for the 50th anniversary of the legendary March on Washington and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s "I Have A Dream" speech. This commemoration will follow the SCLC's 2013 annual convention in Washington, D.C. Dr. C.T. Vivian, who served on Dr. King's Executive Staff said, "We still have to march," and "we must tell the President and Congress that the struggle remains and poverty continues unabated" 50 years later.

Oh what a day it was when distinguished leaders of the civil rights community in Atlanta like Ms. Helen Butler (People's Agenda), Rev. Alfred Love (Concerned Black Clergy), Ms.

Rita Samuels (SCLC Women), GA State Rep. and GABEO President Tyrone Brooks, and Mr. Joe Beasley (RainbowPUSH) smiled with joyous endorsement of the event to come. The King Center CEO, Bernice A. King, daughter of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. avowed, "As we prepare for the 50th Anniversary observance, I look forward to working with the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, an organization where my father served as co-founder and president when he delivered the I Have a Dream' speech."

In contained joy, Rep. Tyrone Brooks set forth details of the event which will begin with SCLC-led marches and motorcades that will start in Birmingham, travel on to Atlanta, tour the Covington, GA jail where five civil rights leaders were locked up for 45 days and trek to the Moores Ford Bridge in Monroe, GA where the lynching of Roger and Dorothy Malcom and George and Mae Murray Dorsey took place. They will travel through South Carolina and North Carolina before the final stop in Washington, D.C.

Bernice King stated, "It is our intention to make the 50th Anniversary observance an inspiring, global and educational celebration, which renews my father's challenge to create a nonviolent society in which justice, shared prosperity, brotherhood and sisterhood can flourish in America and throughout the world."

The 1963 March on Washington had an estimated 250,000 people peacefully advocating for Civil Rights and economic equality for African Americans. Participants marched down Constitution and Independence Avenues 100



years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed and listened to speeches, songs and prayers in front of the Lincoln Monument.

The march was initiated by A. Philip Randolph, international president of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, president of the Negro American Labor Council, and vice president of the AFL-CIO; and sponsored by five of the largest civil rights organizations in the United States. It was a diverse crowd: black and white, rich and poor, young and old, Hollywood stars and everyday people.

The 1963 March on Washington was powerful, peaceful and orderly. The 2013 March on Washington 50 years later will be just as powerful, peaceful and orderly!



Blood Stains Will Remain: The KKK Should Not Be Allowed to Participate in Georgia's Adopt A Highway Program

The Ku Klux Klan is a terrorist organization. They are among the founders of organized domestic terrorism in the United States of America. No matter how they try to change and rebrand their image, and rewrite history – the blood stains will remain.

Georgia is correct in denying the application of the International Keystone Knights of the KKK to participate in GDOT's Adopt A Highway program in Union County, Georgia. It is outrageous that they were ever under consideration. This program is for "civic-minded organizations" that build up the community, not hate-filled terrorist groups seeking its destruction.

As a proud American, a lifelong Georgian, civil rights activist and president of the Georgia

Association of Black Elected Officials (a nonpartisan, multiracial, multicultural organization); I am a strong supporter and believer in our U. S. Constitution. I am a firm believer in the First Amendment which guarantees us "freedom of religion, speech, and the press; rights of assembly and petition." But let us be clear. This is not about Freedom of Speech. This is about allowing a known group of murdering terrorists to adopt our public property and place their brand name on it for public relations, membership and recruitment purposes. This is clearly an attempt to hijack our state property, not a First Amendment Freedom of Speech issue.

I support the right of the KKK to clean up highways and they can call me any name under the sun, moon and stars in the process. I do not support them being legitimized by the state of

Georgia and having the name of this heinous organization placed on our public highways, supported by the tax dollars of all our citizens. If they are sincerely interested in cleaning highways then it should not matter whether they get name recognition for doing so. Organizations defending the KKK should consider using resources to help us in the fight against voter intimidation and suppression and to defend the Quitman 10+2.

The KKK is the Aryan American Al-Qaeda. Their murderous, terroristic roots run deep

throughout the South and this nation. Established at the end of the Civil War, the hooded cowards of the KKK tried to instill fear in formerly enslaved people. Their ideology and philosophy are treasonous. If they could they would abolish the United States in favor of the confederate states. The KKK is responsible for mass murder, church bombings and burnings, lynchings and the destruction of numerous homes and businesses. I authored an antiterrorism law signed in 1983 which created the anti-terrorism squad of the GBI to target violence by hate groups.

It amazes me that anyone would dare to compare the KKK, founded in order to kill, maim, intimidate and suppress people, to multiracial, multicultural civil rights organizations established to work for equal rights, freedom and justice for all people. What ignorance would prevent someone from understanding the difference?

Many of my colleagues and friends (black and white) have been murdered by members of the KKK for standing up for our God-given human rights and the rights of others. Innocent

unborn babies, children, young people, mothers and fathers have all been victims of their venomous cruelty and hatred.

In the 1950s and 60s the Ku Klux Klan threatened to kill my father, Mose Brooks, and burn our house and church because he had a physical altercation with a white man at Wiley's Chevrolet dealership in Warrenton, GA. He had to flee to Philadelphia, PA to escape death. Crosses were burned in front of the house of my grandmother, Ada Myrick Cody. They threatened to kill her and family members because her grandchildren (including me) were picketing, marching and protesting Jim Crow legal segregation in education and public accommodations.

They tried to kill me in Covington (1970), Atlanta (1974), Woodland (1974), Pensacola, Florida (1975-76), Laurel, Mississippi (With Rev. James Orange, 1976), Vienna (1981), Monroe (1982-83), Cumming–Forsyth County (With Hosea Williams, 1987) and Keysville (1987-88). They almost killed Mrs. Evelyn Gibson Lowery, wife of Dr. Joseph Echols Lowery, in Decatur, Alabama (1979). They did kill George and Mae Murray Dorsey and Roger and Dorothy Malcom and their seven month unborn infant on the Moore's Ford Bridge, July 25, 1946.

For a history lesson in heinous KKK genocidal violence, join us at the 1st African Baptist Church, Monroe, Georgia, 12 Noon for the Annual March on the Moore's Ford Bridge (1st Saturday in April) and the Annual Reenactment of the Lynchings at the Moore's Ford Bridge (4th Saturday in July). They hate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. so much that when in 1973 his portrait was placed in the Georgia State Capitol in Atlanta, they marched and rallied around the capitol all day and came into the building later that night and tried to destroy it. They shot Dr. King's crypt following his burial at South View Cemetery in Atlanta several times until it was moved to Ebenezer Baptist Church on Auburn Avenue.

CHRISTIAN DECLARATION OF POSITION REGARDING MARRIAGE

- 1. As a Christian, with all of my faults and shortcomings, I must look to the Bible to define what marriage is and what marriage is not.
- 2. Marriage according to the Bible is between a man and a woman. (Genesis 2:24 "Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.").
- 3. The relationship was established by God between the first man Adam and the first woman Eve, both created by God. (Genesis 2:20 25).
- 4. Though the Bible is my guide, support for homosexual marriages cannot be found even in non-biblical sources. Every system of faith (whether it was called a religion or not) which has had any wide recognition in human history has recognized that marriage is only between men and women, never between persons of the same sex. "The first country to allow same-sex couples to enter into legally recognized marriage was the Netherlands, effective in 2001." Wikipedia, Same-sex marriage.
- 5. Even when marriage has been defined to include polygamy, it was always between men and women, never between several men or several women. As shown in Wikipedia, Same-sex marriage, homosexual "marriages" is a recent invention beginning in the Netherlands in 2001.
- 6. Indeed the Bible is very plain, in both the old and new testament, that homosexual behavior cannot be approved. "Thou shalt not lie with mankind, as with womankind: it is abomination." (Leviticus 18:22).

Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools; And changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man, and to birds, and fourfooted beasts, and creeping things; Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishon our their own bodies between themselves: Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.

For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections: for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature: And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet. And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient. (Romans 1:22 - 26).

- 7. None of this is to say that homosexual behavior is the only sexual behavior unacceptable by the Bible. Sexual intercourse outside of marriage between a man and a woman is also prohibited. (Exodus 20:14 "Thou shalt not commit adultery."; Romans 13:9 "...Thou shalt not commit adultery...").
- 8. At any large gathering of Christians there is likely to be many who have committed, are committing, and/or within a short period of time after that gathering will commit, adultery. Indeed David, God's chosen servant, committed adultery. (2 Samuel 11th and 12th chapters).
- 9. However, there is no movement afoot to stop the Church from preaching the Biblical teachings against adultery. A very large percentage of people who have committed adultery claim to be driven by biological urges which they cannot resist. This is similar to the claims of those who advocate homosexual marriages.
- 10. We have all fallen and come short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.") This includes heterosexuals as well as homosexuals. But it is not God or the Bible that must change. We must change.
- 11. The fundamental message of the Christian faith as stated by Jesus is "Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again." (John 3:7). And, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16).
- 12. As much as I love my homosexual relatives and friends, I cannot go against God and the Bible to endorse homosexual marriage. I respect their choice to not follow the Bible in their personal lives, just as I respect the right of persons to commit adultery.
- 13. But my respect for a person's right to make a private choice does not justify my endorsement of that which the Bible clearly states is wrong. It would be a violation of my conscience and my relationship with God, as well as an encouragement for others to do wrong, for which I would be responsible to my family, society in general and GOD.
- 14. Likewise I stand strongly opposed to any violence against those involved in homosexual behavior. Any act of violence against a person because of homosexual behavior is a sin in and of itself, as well as a crime which should and must be prosecuted.
- 15. It must be clearly understood that the Church must preach the gospel which includes the loving teaching to repent for all sin including homosexual behavior. (Matthew 28: 19-20 "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen).

It is imperative that a clear statement of the position of Christians regarding this issue be put forth. "For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to the battle?" (1 Corinthians 14:8).

"For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." (Ephesians 6:12).

This is not homophobia, which those who seek to silence dialogue quickly label anyone who disagrees with them. This is homolove. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16).
