She also gave an exceptional performance of the gospel favorite "Safe in His Arms."

Perhaps the most memorable and powerful highlight of the evening was a video presentation on the BRC. Shown in two parts and written and directed by Byron Owsley II of Liquid Box Media, these clips really gave the audience another perspective of the organization. Interviews with business owners that are BRC members, as well as pastors who support the cause, were part of the video presentation. Historic pictures of rainmaking African Americans were also fused into the video. I would not let my environment destroy me, beat me down, or make me accept what is said: that my family and my people were inferior to the White man. When a man accepts that designation of inferiority, he might as well die. He has nothing to live for. When he denies his inherent worth and denies that he is a person of infinite worth and value, he is dead even if he lives to be four score years and ten, or even a hundred... The surest sign of an inferiority complex is the idea that whatever Negroes have built must die and is no good.

The late, legendary educator Dr. Benjamin E. Mays could not have stated his ideas in a more eloquent manner. His words give an accurate expression of what the BRC is all about: nurturing Black businesses and Black business owners to a level where all can see, understand, and benefit from the true value that we offer through the provision of excellent goods and services.

Fresh on the heels of a successful second anniversary celebration, I must say that I am truly pleased and honored to be a part of such a distinguished organization. The celebration only reinforced the fact that we've come a long way, and yet we've still got a long way to go. Acknowledging the fact that we've got a long way to go is by no means bad news. Instead, I see it as a ray of hope — one that shows us that we're on the right road to making the BRC an integral part of today's churches and Black-owned businesses.

In two short years, the BRC has been able to attract 52 churches and 200 businesses, a feat that many organizations have not been able to accomplish even after decades of existence. And, to our knowledge, there is no other organization in metro Atlanta that is working to fill the void that the BRC does by seeking to connect churches, Black-owned businesses, and consumers. We truly count this as a blessing from God, and we believe the outlook for the future is even greater. The video presentation that was shown during the second anniversary gala captured the heart of what true partnerships between the church and BRC members mean. There are many testimonies of how businesses have grown as a result of support from the BRC. And there have also been positive reports about the services provided by BRC members.

I encourage each business owner to continue to strive toward excellence in the provision of goods and services. From hair salons to restaurants to dry cleaners to sound and lighting, I am a witness that BRC members are able to deliver goods and services that are a cut above the rest. But the good news is that we can all begin today by supporting Black-owned businesses. And our newspaper, *The Conductor*, provides a full listing of these businesses. There is no time like the present to get on board for a life-changing experience that is destined to bless you as you are a blessing to others. May God continue to bless you. And after you've gotten on board, don't forget to reach back and pull someone else aboard with you. Together, we could do so much more than we could ever do apart. Get on board!

BRC church spotlight Abundant Life Church

The ministry of Abundant Life Church in Lithonia has touched indigenous people around the globe, from Africa to Asia.

In Asia, led by founder and pastor Woodrow Walker, the Abundant Life Church's foreign missions ministry has worked with the Bilaan, a tribe on the island of Mindanao in the Philippines. Beginning in 2003, Abundant Life took steps to expand its ministerial outreach to the Bilaan. "Now we are working on trying to get them financially independent with the help of farming and selling cloth they make out of banana leaves. We want not only to minister but also to help the tribe explore avenues of business so that they can be self-supporting," said Walker.

Abundant Life's ministry work in the Philippines has taken on even greater implications in recent months as the country prepares to elect a new president in May. One of the candidates running for president is Eddie Villaneuva, spiritual director and international president of Jesus Is Lord Church Worldwide in Manila. Villaneuva has asked Pastor Walker to consider coming to the Philippines to aid in training ministers for all of Asia, not just the Philippines. Walker explained that Villaneuva is running for president on a platform of creating partnerships with a number of international ministries. "He is not running just to be president. Villaneuva wants to use his term as president to pave a road for others to come in and restore integrity to the Philippines."

In addition to the Philippines, Abundant Life's foreign missions ministry has traveled to east and west Africa. In 1999, groups journeyed to Delta State, Nigeria, to minister at different churches. While in Nigeria, Pastor Walker took to the radio airwaves to broadcast — with resounding success — the message of Christ's crucifixion.

Pastor Walker said of his Nigeria experience, "There is a need to restore the original message of Christ to these countries. Many in these countries have begun to imitate what they hear, which is the message of prosperity and self. It is doing

see changes in their lives because of the message that we must depend on Christ. In Kenya and Uganda, we saw tremendous healing and miracles happen," said Pastor Walker.

Abundant Life made its first trip to South Africa in 2002, with stops in Johannesburg and Cape Town. Earlier this year, Pastor Walker returned to Johannesburg with a contingent of pastors and business leaders. There, they met with key African business leaders from Atlanta and pastors. "As South Africa continues its transition from apartheid, we've seen the transfer not only of government power but also of economic power," observed Pastor Walker. "While in South Africa earlier this year, we began to network, to discuss how we can assist them to develop businesses in their country."

Pastor Walker added that the Atlanta contingent plans to return to South Africa with intentions of collaborating are at the top of the mind. "We don't want apartheid to change faces. We want to help rebuild South Africa, all the while bringing a message of integrity."

With a global vision of bridging the gap, changing mindsets, and transforming culture to the standard of Christ, Pastor Walker and Abundant Life Church are taking the word of God to the far reaches of the world.

Ray of Hope, New Birth Missionary and Big Miller Grove Embrace Technology with Open Arms

Always known as a place of solace, a sanctuary for the soul and spirit, these days the African American church is also an epicenter of constant-changing technology. From descriptive Web sites to live service broadcasts, the church is meeting the challenges of the 21st century seemingly with open arms. Ray of Hope, New Birth Missionary, and Big Miller Grove are three churches that have embraced the evolving wave of technology and have simultaneously reshaped the face and functionality of their respective churches.

Ray of Hope Church in Stone Mountain, where Rev. Dr. Cynthia Hale presides, is a leading member of the technology-enhanced, faith-based community. Through Web-site, both members and non-members can view the church services and Wednesday's Bible study through a live broadcast and rebroadcasting. The director of multimedia at Ray of Hope, Sean Barnave, quickly points out the contributions of technology as it relates to the church's overall functionality, effectiveness, and exposure. "We get e-mails all the time about how it is a great service to our members if they are not able to get to our service. It is definitely a value-added service to our congregation," says Barnave.

"With 25,000 members, we need to have technology in place in order to serve the congregation."

In addition to the live broadcasting and re-broadcasting of the services, Ray of Hope has lectures and services available for sale on CD-ROM. According to Barnave, Ray of Hope is in the planning stages of providing e-commerce through its Web site. Through the site people may purchase items such as CDs and videotapes with just a push of a button. Barnave reveals that he keeps himself abreast of the ever-changing world of technology by reading the latest books and manuals to help keep Ray of Hope one step ahead. Oftentimes, Barnave will find himself at bookstores around the city perusing the latest computer books. "I have to keep myself abreast of what's going on for the benefit of the kingdom," Barnave concludes.

Riding on the technology wave is New Birth

Missionary Baptist Church in Lithonia. With just one look at the Web site, it is easy to see the church is technologically progressive. New Birth's Web site is phenomenal because the volume of information available is quite impressive. Under the leadership of its pastor, Bishop Eddie Long, New Birth is bursting at the seams with ingenuity and creativity that is evident through the information-packed Web site.

Through their Web site, you can obtain information about New Birth's history, human resources, staff directory, and upcoming events, as well as church news and information on their own school, Faith Academy. You can even take a virtual tour of this newly constructed church on the Web site; you can check out the chapel, bookstore and video room to name a few. Books and videos are also available for purchase from New Birth's virtual bookstore. New Birth also offers a live broadcast of its services as well as rebroadcasts of previous services.

Kimberly Clark, the information technology coordinator at New Birth Missionary, credits the use of technology for the church's overall organization. "With 25,000 members, we need to have technology in place in order to serve the congregation," Clark states. Through various databases, New Birth keeps track of members' information, as well as conference information. Certain areas of the church are often rented out to other groups for special events; according to Clark, this information has to be organized and maintained through the use of databases and specialized software.

To help its members become computer savvy, New Birth offers classes in basic computer applications as a component of the Life Skills program. Clark is excited to announce that New Birth will soon offer computer-networking classes for those seeking to take their computer expertise to the next level.

A perfect marriage between the church and technology is nowhere more conceptualized than in Streaming Faith, a global, faith-based Web site that carries the broadcasting and rebroadcasting of nearly 200 churches' services. A free service to anyone surfing the Web, Streaming Faith Web site crosses international waters to reach people from Nigeria to Israel. "Our mission is to provide churches and faith-based organizations with cutting-edge technology that allows them to deliver their audio and video



messages over the Internet to a global audience," says Chance Mason, president of Streaming Faith.

In business since 2000, Streaming Faith, an Atlanta-based company, has received rave reviews from its users over the years. According to Mason, the influx of e-mails praising the service continues to pour in. Mason is thrilled to see the warm reception his Web site receives; however, for him the bigger picture is what fuels him – the role Streaming Faith has in the African American community. Mason hopes that as more people seeking spiritual guidance log on to Streaming Faith, they will be more inclined to use the Web for other purposes, thereby reducing the digital divide existing between different ethnic groups. In fact, Mason refers to a recent study conducted by the Pew Research Center, which found that 81 percent of Whites have access to the Internet, compared with 78 percent of African Americans. The gap is certainly closing in on the digital divide.

In both big and small ways, the African American church is meeting the technological challenges of the 21st century with open arms. Downloadable information, virtual bookstores, live service broadcasts – the African American church is truly a sign of our techno times.

Profile: Mark of Distinction

Mark of Distinction has moved to 632 People Street, a renovated home in the West End in 2004. In addition to hair care, the new location allows Jones to offer expanded services to both men and women that includes massages, manicures and pedicures, shoe shines and computer access. "God has given me a vision for a salon that caters to all the needs someone may have."

Mark Jones realized he was onto a possible career when he developed a following at Morehouse College early on as the person other students could rely on to give a good haircut. Some 25 years later, Jones has literally grown up with many of his clientele as they've gotten married, had children, and even become grandparents.

Jones is the owner of Mark of Distinction barbershop in the West End. Since establishing his shop in 1991, Jones has made a point of keeping his business family-oriented. "It's not just doing hair that's important, it's the atmosphere and presentation of surroundings that are important; too," says Jones, the father of two boys and a girl. "My shop is

spiritually sound. A guy can bring in his daughters and feel comfortable. We have an atmosphere that's quite peaceful. I've seen folks come in and leave because it's not the typical barbershop . . . Many of my clientele are business oriented; they're entrepreneurs, pastors, and lawyers."

Because 30 to 40 percent of his clients own a business, Jones encourages his clients to network with and patronize each other's business. Jones calls it "in-house networking." And he heeds his own advice, often referring his clients when he learns about a business opportunity.

"How can we survive if we don't support each other?" Jones asks. "Money turns over 13 to 18 times in communities. We have that potential; we come from that kind of legacy, but it's not being stressed and taught to our young people."

An Albany, New York native, Jones came to Atlanta by way of Freeport, Long Island, in the mid-1970s to study business administration. With a growing roster of hair care clients, Jones decided to take advantage of the fact that he was good with his hands and went

to work part time at a barbershop near Morehouse in 1979. Although he was not formally trained, Jones already had a portfolio and about 50 clients by that time.

He stayed with Melvin's Hair Styles for six years and earned his cosmetology license before taking on a joint-venture hair salon with a friend. After five years, the joint-venture ended and Jones took over the lease for the salon which he renamed Mark of Distinction. Today, Jones personally serves about 45 to 50 clients a week. Three other barbers work alongside him in the shop.

For the last 10 years, Jones has also had a mobile hair care service called Straight To You that goes directly to his clients' place of business. "The whole plan for the mobile service is to save time and energy for those who don't have time to come get a haircut," he explains.

In five years, Jones envisions Mark of Distinction as a landmark business in Atlanta, particularly for black males. With his drive and commitment evident, Jones is certainly on his way to making it happen.

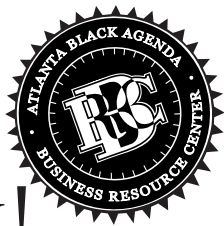

Church Spotlights Metro World Outreach Center's

Sharing Way: An Economic & Spiritual Initiative

Through history, the church has played a pivotal role in the lives of its members; and as the church reinvents itself to keep up with our ever-changing, technology-enhanced society, so do its initiative. One such initiative is the Sharing Way program.

Sharing Way is an economic program that bridges the gap between participating churches and participating merchants, and the result is a mutually rewarding endeavor that truly serves as an investment in the community. The executive director of Sharing Way, Dr. Coy Barker of Metro World Outreach Center, appropriately describes it as a "win-win situation" for all involved. And it really is; this service is free for all churches and merchants involved, which lends greatly to the program's appeal. Oftentimes, retailers and restaurants have to pay heavily for advertising; however, Sharing Way requires no up-front money, and the only time money is paid is after the transaction.

This highly sophisticated system is executed through the usage of a prepaid Sharing Way MasterCard or a regular debit or credit card, depending on the choice of the member. After the business transaction is completed, the rebated money is given back to the church to offset various costs incurred by the church and therefore its members. It is a seemingly easy process; according to Dr. Barker, "You don't have to tell the merchant anything. You just go in with your Sharing Way card or your registered credit card; it goes through the system electronically, and then once a month the church is issued the total dollars that have been spent," he says.

Members have access to their personal Sharing Way account online or by phone, 24 hours a day, where they can check spending reports and rebates to their ministries.

"Community involvement – related" Sharing Way is a marketing company. On the ministry side of it (and thereas on Metro World Outreach is involved), Sharing Way is a support organization committed to increasing the income of churches and also nonprofit organizations," Dr. Barker explains. Dr. Barker's very own church, Metro World Outreach Center, became an official member in December of last year; and as previously mentioned, he is the executive director of Sharing Way.

Located in Stone Mountain, Metro World Outreach Center is an international church with a congregation representing 31 nations. With such diversity, Metro World celebrates and acknowledges the myriad cultures and ethnicities that worship there every week. "I believe that if you take a photograph of your community and it is a multicultural community, then you should also have that kind of church," Dr. Barker states in a matter-of-fact tone. "Metro Atlanta, with many, many cultures, should be, as God's people open to all of those cultures to come and worship," he adds.

"We have tried to impart and instill into these 31 nations that worship with us that every one of them has the ability by the gift of God to enter into an abundant life," says Dr. Barker. Helping the congregation to be active, self-sufficient, healthy, and whole individuals, Metro World offers programs in the areas of financial planning, career development, and life skills. And Sharing Way is just one more program that aids in this objective.

In addition to Metro World Outreach, the other churches in the Atlanta area are participating in this innovative program include Abundant Life, International Christian Fellowship, Word of Faith Family Worship Center, Hopewell Baptist Church and World Harvest Church. Membership continues to grow for both churches and merchants, in Atlanta some of those merchants are UPS stores; selected CVS Stores; The Trinity Times; Cleopatra Diamonds, Inc.; Liberty Tax Service in Lawrenceville; and Printing Plus in Roswell.

Already on the receiving end of accolades, last year Sharing Way was the recipient of the prestigious Leadership Award presented at the 10th Annual Restaurant Leadership Conference in Scottsdale, Arizona.

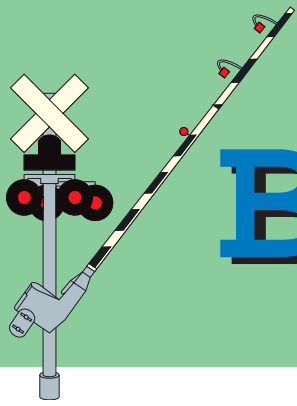

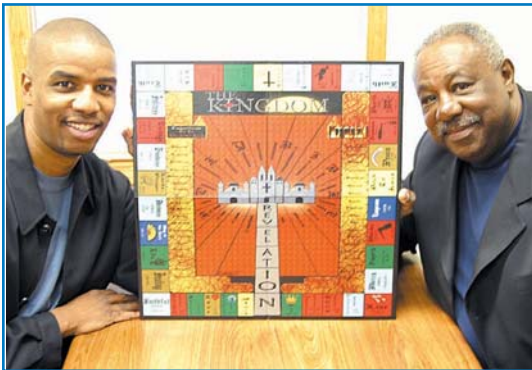

"I took 20 miracles from the New Testament that Jesus performed and made up the miracle cards of the game. If you happen to land on the penalty square and you don't have a miracle card or a Jesus card or a repent card, you have to go to the lone suffering block," Martin explains. He further elaborates, "You must have a Jesus card in order to enter the Kingdom, and the first person who enters the Kingdom earns the crown; but the game continues until everyone gets in, because everyone must bear his or her own burden to get into the Kingdom."
